
























### **Justice Within Reach**














### **Conservation, Adaptation, & Co-creation**

### **Transformative Change**

Work in this area supports organisations facilitating research to advance the human understanding of severe mental health conditions. Additionally, in order to expand the number of people receiving mental health care, small grants are made to organisations providing direct therapy and relief.















### INDIA CLIMATE COLLABORATIVE

The flexible nature of the RNP grant, which does not tie the funding towards specific themes or climate sub-sectors, has made it possible for us to support smaller projects and deploy small sums of money for systemic work such as scoping exercises, seed grants and coalition building. ### WELL LABS

Developed a wastewater reuse model for Bengaluru, advocating for recycled water usage in landscape irrigation and construction released in April 2024. The policy, approved by the cabinet and included in the budget session, potentially saved up to 15% of Bengaluru's water during the driest months.



### **Impact Stories**

### PAAR

The Chief Justice of India has formed a committee to explore the expansion of open prisons, and the J&K High Court has requested PAAR's assistance in conducting the conference and passing relevant orders.

Allahabad High Court directs State to study 'open jails' concept for welfare for convicts

The Court emphasised on the need to study models from various states to develop a more effective reformative mechanism.



### CIVIS

Civis Gathered 1,992 responses on the Draft Rajasthan Guaranteed Delivery of Public Services and Accountability Bill, 2022, and collaborated with SEBI on multiple consultations, with 72% of citizen feedback incorporated into a final regulation.



# **Impact Stories**



### HAIYYA

Their Youth for Climate Action program trained 15 youth-led climate action projects across India. One group mobilized 8000 fisherfolk to demand their rights, while another got the Kolkata Mayor to announce a Climate Action Plan for the city.

### SEARCH

In Wadsa, their women-led organization mobilized 200+ women to successfully demand action against illegal liquor stockists and dealers, with the administration taking legal action to clamp down on sales. Conducted an awareness generation program on alcohol and tobacco in 393 government schools, engaging 30,000+ students and 1200+ teachers across the Gadchiroli district.



### CENTRE FOR WILDLIFE STUDIES

Published four international peer-reviewed scientific articles. Their Wild Seve program has filed 22,589 claims for communities around Bandipur and Nagarahole wildlife reserves since 2015, facilitating ~INR 5.9 crores in compensation. Wild Shaale reached 9,768 children across 226 schools.



### SOCRATUS FOUND

Co-hosted the inaugural Food Systems Dialogue with Bharat Krishak Samaj, a multi-stakeholder forum on sustainable food systems. Two keywords emerged -'Systems' and 'Local'. Hosted 4 successful citizen juries on topics like waste management, sustainable agriculture, renewable energy, air pollution and health, demonstrating effective public deliberation.

### WILDLIFE CONSERVATION TRUST

**Impact Stories** 

Supported community-led efforts to secure forest rights of Van Gujjars in Uttarakhand and Gaumukh Parishad in Maharashtra, to strengthen local stewardship of forests and wildlife.

16 IDIA Scholars from secured prestigious jobs at top law firms and corporate houses, while one was successful in the legal education enabling socio-economic mobility.

Supported 18,700 students from low-income families to access seats in private schools under the RTE Act in Odisha through online application support and liaising with district education officials.





### WWF-INDIA

Supported the declaration of community forest resource rights of 50,000+ hectares claimed by 7 tribal villages within the Anamalai Tiger Reserve - a historic first in Tamil Nadu.

Facilitated access to entitlements worth INR 2 crores for 1900+ informal workers through their para-legal aid center 'Samudhayik Adhikar Kendra' in Madhya Pradesh.




